Description and Classification

Sure Flex A6 Acrylic is a specially designed liquid component formulated to be combined with Sure Flex 6004 mortar powder to make a high strength adhesive with flexibility for bonding all types of ceramic or natural stone tiles to various sound substrates.

Where to Use

As a two part component adhesive for Sure Flex 6004 powder and for a wide range of applications where high bond, flexibility and resistance to water is required.

Characteristics

Sure Flex A6 Acrylic is a white viscous liquid that is ready to use at the ratio of 4 parts of Sure Flex 6004 powder to 1 part of Sure Flex A6.

Recommendations

Sure Flex A6 Acrylic should only be used in combination with Sure Flex 6004 powder component to achieve the required performance specified by Australian Standard AS 4992.1

Cleaning

Tools and surfaces should be cleaned with water or a damp cloth before the Acrylic sets

Storage

Sure Flex A6 can be stored for 24 months in unopened original containers in a normal indoor environment.

Safety Instructions

Sure Flex A6 is non toxic and non flammable. It is advisable to wear gloves in accordance with sound occupational safety practice.
